With warm smiles they took the opportunity to practice their English by getting to know me, asking questions about who I was, why I was there and other various greetings.

Some students shared their stories, where they came from and why, as well as engaging in the quintessential British topic of recent weather.

Already I could tell this was an incredibly warm and wonderful group of people, and my shy, reserved exterior melted away instantly. It felt like I was meeting and catching up with old friends.

The next phase was teaching practice over the course of several weeks. I got to meet and teach learners from Ukraine, Hong Kong, Spain, Iran and so many others.

Even when I would unsuccessfully experiment in my teaching practice, the students always seemed happy just to be there, still giving their 100%.



It's difficult to place where the students are in their progress. Our lessons were set at beginner, intermediate, upper intermediate and advanced, but there was plenty of crossover as well. Every student brought something to the lesson, and had different experiences.

This meant that every lesson might have one or two students already using my grammar or vocabulary points who could share their experience and understanding.

My life plan is to teach English in Japan, and teaching here even for a short time has inspired me so much.
